Multiple churches, organizations, and groups come together to provide hot meals for our neighbors in need in Ocean Beach every Saturday morning and Wednesday evening.

During much of the year, all are invited to join in a simple prayer or informal worship before the meal and healthcare, offered by Cal State San Marcos nursing students and volunteer medical professionals, is available on site.

For Wednesday evening meals, cooking is done at home using recipes provided and the prepared food transported to the ECC. In addition to cooking, volunteers set up, serve the meal, and clean up afterwards.

On Saturdays, cooking is done in the ECC kitchen. Volunteers cook/prepare meals, serve, and clean the kitchen. There is a wide range of volunteer opportunities in residential living, intergenerational care, ministry services, and operations. Possibilities include reception greeters, arts & crafts, board games, story time, walking residents, bingo, food servers, picnic helpers, data entry, and many more. Reflecting the breadth of possibilities, the volunteer application invites you to list any "special skills or hobbies that you could share with our residents."

Requirements for volunteering include

- Current negative TB test
- Current Flu Vaccination (Seasonal)
- Health Screening (PACE Volunteers Only)
- Complete a 2 Hour Volunteer Orientation

Some opportunities may also require a background check.

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## Vida Joven de México (formerly Dorcas House)

Binational, Non-profit

Vida Joven provides a safe, loving home for especially vulnerable children in Tijuana. Trips from the San Diego area to visit the children are regularly planned.

Vida Joven de México provides a home in Tijuana for children ages 3-18 years who have been abused, abandoned, or neglected. In this home every child is loved, protected and educated.

## Vida Joven cont'd.

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The work of caring for these children is done as a bi-national collaboration. The children are fortunate to have people on both sides of the border committed to their well-being.

Vida Joven de Mexico in the United States is headquartered in San Diego, and is a 501(c)(3) nonprofit organization, governed by a Board of Directors. Funds to support the home and children come exclusively from charitable donations. Most donations are made by individuals in the U.S.

Visits to Vida Joven are scheduled on Saturdays, generally twice each month. Confirmed visitors (those who have registered by the previous Wednesday) meet at St. John's Chula Vista where they may leave their cars and travel to Tijuana by 15-passenger van. The cost of transportation is \$10 per person (\$20 for a family).

“What happens on the trip? We have fun! You will share your love and attention with these wonderful kids. There might be an organized art project, or we might just hang out and play games with the kids. We arrive at the home by 10:00 a.m. and leave again around 12:00 noon.

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## Sumitra

Sumitra is a refugee mentoring effort supported by St. Luke's. Sumitra means “having good friends.”

Sumitra currently has a need for volunteers to tutor refugees in obtaining their driving permit. This would mean spending a few hours a week teaching them the questions on the test (this is not teaching them to drive!). All materials needed are provided, and many of the sessions are organized and held at the International Refugee Committee offices.

People could come for just one session, or choose to work with one person until they pass the test.

Sumitra also needs help connecting refugee families with wifi in their homes. Most have been given refurbished computers, but are unable to connect to the internet. This would require 1-2 trips to their homes and phone conversations with Cox to get service established.

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# Grounds / Garden Café Site Preparation

The Garden Café will activate the corner lot of 30th and Gunn with the creation of a new organic urban farm and outdoor café through IRC's (International Refugee Committee's) Youth FarmWorks and Project CHOP job training programs for low-income youth and refugee women. The Garden Café will serve handcrafted teas, coffees, baked goods and salads prepared by refugee women employed in Project CHOP and operating out of St.

Luke's renovated commercial kitchen. Youth FarmWorks-grown vegetables will be sold at the North Park Farmers' Market and utilized in Project CHOP products.

In conjunction with this program, volunteer assistance is needed to help rehabilitate the parkways surrounding St. Luke's and level the soil in what will eventually be the café seating area. Robin Taylor, Relational Justice Coordinator at St. Luke's, can provide dates and information for upcoming work days.
